

**Assistant or Associate Professor Position
ASL/English Interpreting**

The University of North Florida, College of Education and Human Services invites applications for a 9 month, tenure-earning position as an **Assistant or Associate Professor in a newly developed American Sign Language Interpreting degree program**, beginning in August 2007.

The **position requirements** include:

- an earned doctorate in ASL/English Interpreting, Deaf Education, Special Education, Linguistics, or a related field and
- national certification from RID or NAD.

- **Note:** Individuals with a Master's degree in a field named above and extensive (minimum of 10 years) interpreting related work experience and professional consulting experience and certifications from RID or NAD shall be considered as well. Evidence of successful experience as an interpreter for individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing, evidence of experience as a teacher of sign language interpreters, evidence of or potential for scholarly research and writing, strong positive interpersonal skills, and a vision and a commitment to excellence in personnel preparation within the field of sign language interpretation.

Preference will be given to individuals:

- multiple certifications from RID,
- university teaching experience in ASL Interpreting, ASL, or Deaf Education,
- evidence of scholarly productivity,
- experience and commitment to working with diverse populations,
- experience in program development, and
- experience delivering instruction via distance learning technologies.

The salary range is \$50,000 - negotiable, depending upon qualifications and experience. The position is open until filled. Review of applications will begin on February 12, 2007. **Applicants must apply online at <http://www.unfjobs.org>** and must submit all required documents to be considered for this position.
